News from the staffroom

Ms. Taylor, a PE visiting specialist teacher, will continue to work with the children on Tuesday mornings until the end of term. As well as taking the children for PE, she will be also teaching them German. Mrs. Gordon, a student teacher, will be with us until the end of May.

News from the classroom

We are involved in two very exciting projects this term. One involves working with Raonaid Mackrory and a local artist Anne Murray, to create a Parish Map using textiles and fabrics. This is a fantastic opportunity for the children and will involve them learning a lot about the history of the local

area. The second project involves investigating sound through science in the classroom and then exploring how sound can be used by an artist - Dave Martin - to create visual images. The focus of this project will be on looking how creativity informs both science and art. Everything associated with these projects will be risk assessed and conducted in a way to ensure 'Covid – safety' including some online sessions between school and the people involved.
